A Note from the Director

One of the benefits of being a faculty member here at Saginaw Valley is creative freedom to select the titles we direct each year. My colleagues and I are careful to select plays to give theatre majors a breadth of experiences over their four years in college (dramas, comedies, classics, musicals, theatre for young audiences, etc..), but within that framework we have a great deal of latitude. However, we are also responsive to student input. I was thrilled when *Legally Blonde* was repeatedly requested as it's given me the chance to direct a show that I've been in love with since the 2008 MTV show *The Search for Elle Woods* and the 2001 Reece Witherspoon film before it.

The main hesitation I've had about this musical is its scale. The choreography, the music, the spectacle: it's a formidable challenge in almost every area. My goal was to be strategic with our time and resources, to highlight the core of the show: matching the outside with the inside. To that end my directorial concept is an Elle Magazine photo spread, reflected in the frames filling the stage, some illuminated from the outside and some within, and of course through the vibrant and dynamic costumes.

Scale is a challenge, but it's also an opportunity. You're seeing 29 actors onstage (and two dogs!) along with 13 musicians in the orchestra pit, but there is an equal number of crew and creatives backstage and beyond who brought *Legally Blonde* to life. Students taking general education theatre classes learned while doing by supporting sets, costumes, and lights. I'm incredibly proud and thankful of the time, energy, and talent poured into this production.

Building *Legally Blonde the Musical* has been a whirlwind ride, full of work, joy, and discovery. I'm thankful you're sharing in it tonight as part of the audience; you're in for a treat. Enjoy the show!

Kyle, Violinist:
















Director:
